

### **TULU SANGHA 1. Introduction, objectives and Expected outcome**

**Tulu** is a <u>Dravidian language</u> spoken mainly in the south west part of the Indian state of <u>Karnataka</u> and also in the <u>Kasaragod</u> district of <u>Kerala</u>. The Tulu speaking region is often referred to as <u>Tulu Nadu</u>. The native speakers of Tulu are referred to as Tuluva or <u>Tulu people</u>.

<u>Robert Caldwell</u>, in his pioneering work on Comparative Grammar of the Dravidian or South-Indian family of languages, called this language "peculiar and very interesting". According to him, "Tulu is one of the most highly developed languages of the Dravidian family. It looks as if it had been cultivated for its own sake. Tulu is the primary spoken language in Tulu Nadu, a region comprising the districts of <u>Dakshina Kannada</u> and <u>Udupi.</u>

#### **Objectives of Tulu Sangha**


- To inculcate tulu culture in the young minds.

Tulu Nadu, the "Para shurama Sristi" land is known for its unique culture. The art of Yakshagana, Bhoota Kola, Naga Tambila, Kambala, Piliveshaetc are very famous and has earned respect for Tuluvas worldwide. Tulu names. Tuluvas follow a matrilineal system of inheritance known as Aliyasantana, where inheritance is from uncle to nephew.Tuluva New Year is called *Bisuparba*,which falls on the same day as Baisakhi, Vishu and the Thai New Year.

Tuluva Pardanas are sung narratives, which are part of several closely related singing traditions in Tulu language, Pardans are sung during occasions which describe the evolution of Tulu tribes and Tulu culture. He Said that the languages do not develop only through reading and writing. The tradition of worshiping daivas is the base of developing languages.
