Keynote Address by Prof. Muniraj Renjala

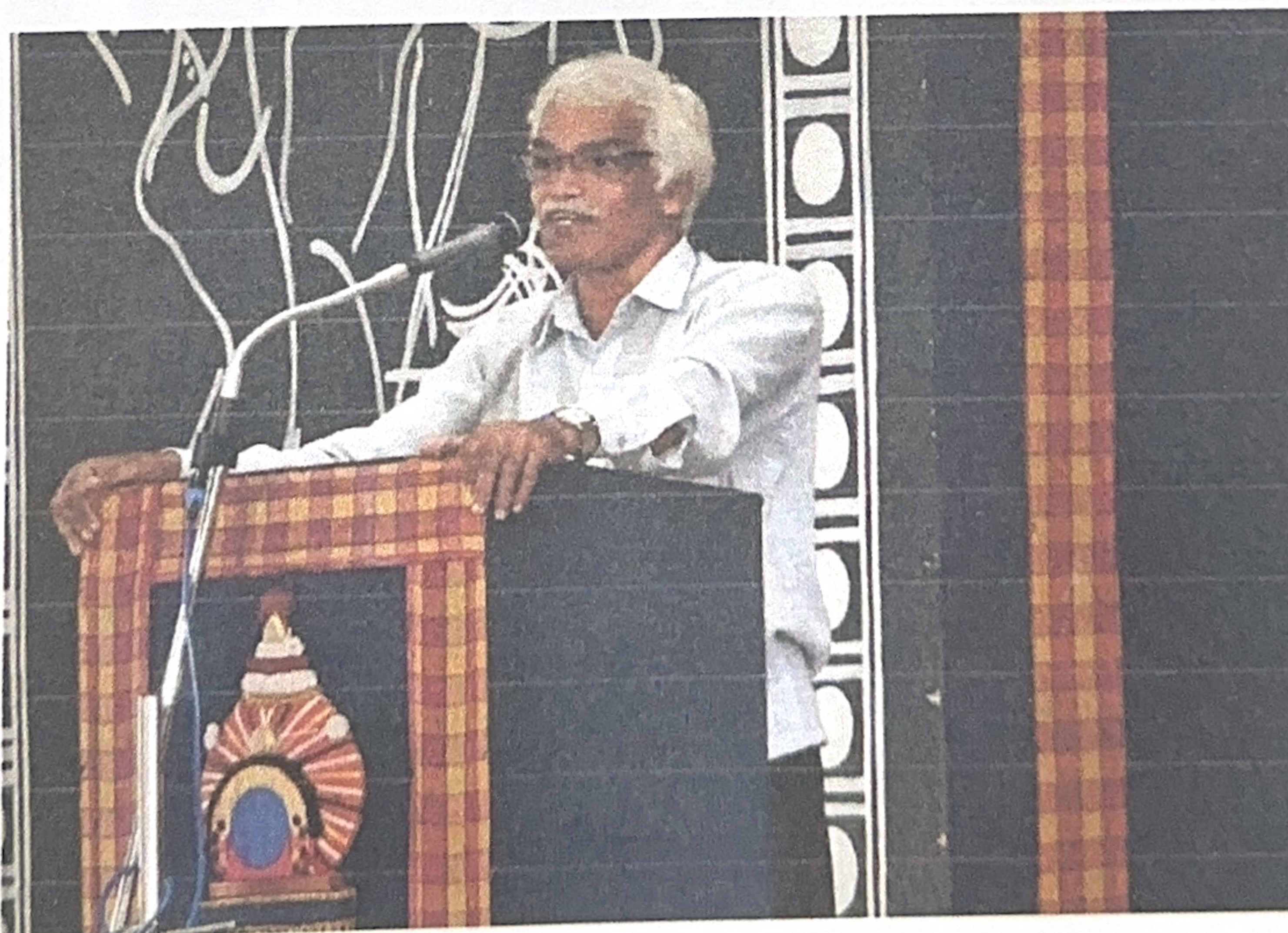




