Summary of Talk:

Human health has always been influenced by climate and weather. Changes in climate and climate variability, particularly changes in weather extremes, affect the environment that provides us with clean air, food, water, shelter, and security. Climate change, together with other natural and human-made health stressors, threatens human health and well-being in numerous ways. Some of these health impacts are already being experienced in the world. Given that the impacts of climate change are projected to increase over the next century, certain existing health threats will intensify and new health threats may emerge. Connecting our understanding of how climate is changing with an understanding of how those changes may affect human health can inform decisions about mitigating (reducing) the amount of future climate change, suggest priorities for protecting public health, and help identify research needs.

Despite the sources of uncertainty described above, the current state of the science allows an examination of the likely direction of and trends in the health impacts of climate change. Over the past ten years, the models used for climate and health assessments have become more useful and more accurate.

The name Tiger Lake is because tigers used to come to this lake to drink. Pilikula nisargadhama is an integrated theme park with a wide variety of features, it is majorly focused on the wildlife species of western Ghats. It is also called Dr. Shivaram karanth Biological Park is the only zoo recognized as breeding centre for King Cobras. It is also functioning as a rescue center for wounded wild life. Today Pilikula zoo has 400 animals, reptiles and birds and most of the species are breeding.

As we proceeded, we were offered with an opportunity to have a view at the wonderfully narrated 3D animation related to animals, birds and planets and many science innovation models. The knowledge provided at the center helped us to gather some useful information related to our studies and innovation. The visit to this place made a remarkable effect for our studies in the future. The Regional Science Centre (PSRC) in Pilikula, Mangalore was set up jointly by the department of Science and Technology. The Science Centre is set up in an area of about 10 acres, having a built-up area of approx. 4000 sq.m. It houses 3 exhibition galleries, a temporary exhibition hall, an inflatable dome planetarium, a 3D theatre facility, library, conference hall, computer room, a small workshop for maintenance of exhibits and public facilities.

The study tour has given useful information that helped us in knowing many vital information that we never witnessed. 

The SRISTI Club Volunteers of AIET had been to Pilikula Regional Science Center administered by the DK district admiration for a special Sky-Gauzing Event. This program was devoted to the popularization of Astronomy among students and the public.

Skygazing, or more literally *gazing at the sky*, is an activity for leisure or with interest in amateur astronomy. Astronomical observations are generally made with the naked eye or with basic optical aids. Simple naked-eye observations of the sky can reveal a great deal about the basics of astronomy and give a better understanding of the cosmos. At the same time, instruments, such as telescopes, are used to study deep space. Many different celestial objects can be viewed while sky-gazing during both night and daytime.

Along with sky watching a special seminar is also organized for our students by resource person **Mr. Atul Bhatt of PPC College Udupi**. He demonstrated the usage of telescopes, binoculars, and astronomy software for sky-watching. He demonstrated the use of Stellarium software, a free open-source planetarium for our computer. It shows a realistic sky in 3D, just like what we see with the naked eye, binoculars, or a telescope.



- Beach cleaning makes sea food safer.





















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SRISTI Club Report (April 2023)

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Tree Audit in Mangalore city

Venue: Mangalore city

Date: 21 to 28/5/2023

OBJECTIVES: the audit is to quantify the carbon fixation created by the city's green cover to mitigate climate change and create awareness amongst the public and all stakeholders regarding the Mangalore city green cover. The tree counting is required to know whether Mangaluru city actually has enough trees to balance the amount of carbon emission being recorded. A 70% of carbon emission is a root cause for the poor Air Quality Index (AQI) value and increase in the temperature. This can be controlled and reduced by trees since they can accumulate atmospheric carbon and fix them.

DETAILS: NITTE (Deemed to be) University launched a tree counting initiative in Mangaluru city on Sunday, May 21. This live tree counting session started from Kadri Park at 6.30 a.m. under the auspices of the Nitte University Green Initiative Project Committee and Sustainable Development Goals Cell of the university. It is a voluntary project of the university, along with Nitte Students SRISTI-Club volunteers also participated in this tree counting activity. A total of 17 volunteers led by Prof Smitha Hegde (NITTE University) initiated this tree counting.

The tree audit is done by measuring and identifying individual trees in and around Mangalore city and mapping them. "With this, the carbon sequestration is calculated using non-destructive allometric formulas that give the carbon that is sequestered by individual trees which can be clubbed to find out the total carbon sequestered by the trees of Mangalore in a year. This, when compared with the carbon emission data, we can come to know how far or ahead we are when it comes to being carbon neutral or carbon positive."

OUTCOMES:

- Awareness among the student community about the need for trees for a safe green city.
- Great way to make new friends & build relationships with people, who are about the environment.
- To foster and mentor green city initiatives that strive towards sustainable city growth.
- Explore green options in all plans.




Fig.4. Geo-tag insertion and testing




Fig.4. SRISTI-Club Volunteers doing beach cleaning


